Plea on stock

An appeal to producers not to make the Gepps Cross market a dumping ground for poor ground for poor quality stock was made last week by the chairman of the Metropolitan and Export Abattoirs Board (Mr. G. Joseph). Abattoirs Joseph).

Such dumping could lead to the exclusion of better quality stock and the large numbers of lambs now coming forward for slaughter, Mr. Joseph said.

The board appreciated the plight of producers, but it was very concerned at the large numbers of emaciated sheep being forwarded for sale.

All stock bought for slaughter at the board's works had first to pass a stringent pre-slaughter examination by a veterinary officer of the Commonwealth Department of Primary Industry, and secondly, a post-mortem inspection on the slaughter floor.
