CRITERIA FOR WALL OF FAME AWARD

The wall of Fame award was instigated by the promotions committee in 1991

Members of that committee were D. Thalbourne, J. Billing, I. Wareing, W. Walford, J. Hofman and R. Marchant

The canteen was built and run by the committee with the profits going to starting the Wall of Fame.

This policy sets out the minimum criteria to be eligible for nomination for an award of The Wall of Fame of the South Australian Homing Pigeon Association Inc. This award exists to recognise the valuable contribution of individual flyers to the current and future existence of the Association. It is therefore only to be awarded in exceptional circumstances.

Criteria - Updated March 2018

In considering the award to The Wall of Fame, an individual being considered for nomination must meet at least one of the **primary** criteria:

- 1) Demonstrated significant and sustained high quality service.
- 2) Valued leadership and good role modelling, that reflects creditably upon the Association.
- 3) An individual has been a champion of the sport by winning the SAHPA Aggregate Points on 3 or more occasions.

The individual must also meet at least three of the five **secondary** criteria when being considered:

- 1) Commitment to the principles of good sportsmanship.
- 2) Ten years voluntary service to the SAHPA, this may be the aggregate of several roles and functions.
- 3) To be a continuous financial member for at least ten years.
- 4) To be in the top thirty points 70% of the time of any ten year period.
- 5) Demonstrated the ability to develop a strain of pigeons that will win or be placed in races for other flyers.
